RULES AND REGULATIONS

ALL GENERAL RULES APPLY

- All exhibits of fruits, nuts, and vegetables must be the products of Polk County, and must have been grown by the exhibitor upon the lands occupied by him as owner or renter.
- 2. Entries should be attractive and uniform in size and shape, and be clean and blemish free.
- 3. Exhibitors must attach names of all varieties entered by them, judges may refuse to award premiums to varieties not correctly named.
- 4. Blemished or frozen fruit may not be entered or considered by the judges, no award will be made on an entry that does not merit it.
- 5. Entries must be grown since the 2014 Fair (see exception under Nut Crops).
- 6. More information may be obtained from the Division Superintendent. "Selecting and Preparing Vegetables for Exhibit" (no. EC-653) is available through the Polk County Extension Office.
- 7. Extra credit for including <u>correct</u> variety name.
- All Scarecrows MUST be in place no later than 8:00pm or they will be disqualified.
