RULES AND REGULATIONS

ALL GENERAL RULES APPLY

1. All exhibits of threshed grains, legumes and grass seed shall be exhibited in containers furnished by the Fair.
2. All exhibits must remain intact until 10:00am Sunday August 14th.

THRESHED GRAINS

Wheat is grown principally for milling purposes or for seed and is judged from that standpoint. All grains are judged for excellence of characteristic, freedom from smut and other diseases, and from foreign matter (weed seeds, dirt, etc.). These points can be attained where pure varieties were sown and by proper cleaning and grading of exhibits. Similar treatment will answer for preparation of the grass seed exhibit.

SHEAF GRAINS AND FORAGE CROPS

(Tie all sheaves with string)

Grain and grass sheaves should be bright clean straw, tightly tied and not less than 2 in. diameter at the middle tie. In selecting grain for sheaf exhibits, the material should be gathered just as the exhibit matures, selecting even heads in length and size and kept in a cool place until it is prepared for exhibit. Grains should be stripped of leaves and tied tightly. Legume sheaves should be selected when the materials are just past full bloom or while the leaves are still in full dark color.
