

Family Support Expenditures

(a) Behavior Consultation, Assessment of the child. The needs of the provider or family and the environment; development of a positive behavior support plan; implementation of the positive behavior support plan with the provider or family; and revision and monitoring of the plan as needed.

(b) Community Inclusion, assists a child to acquire, retain or improve skills in the community.

(c) Environmental Accessibility Adaptations, physical adaptation to a child's home or family vehicle which are necessary to ensure the health, welfare, and safety of the child in the home, or which enable the child to function with greater independence around the home and in family activities.

(d) Family Training, training, coaching, and support provided to the family of a child with developmental disabilities to increase capabilities to care for, support and maintain the child in the home.

(e) Occupational Therapy / Physical Therapy, the services of a professional licensed under ORS 675.240 that are defined and approved for purchase under the approved State Medicaid Plan. These services are available to maintain a child's skills or physical condition when prescribed by a physician and after the service limits of the State Medicaid Plan have been reached, either through private or public resources.

(f) Respite Care, short-term care and supervision provided on an intermittent basis because of the absence, or need for relief, of persons normally providing the care to a child with developmental disabilities.

(g) Special Diets, specially prepared food supplements or particular types of food supplements needed to sustain the child in the family home, ordered by a physician, and monitored at least every six months by a dietitian licensed according to ORS 691.415 through 691.465.

(h) Specialized Equipment and Supplies, equipment, furnishing, or supplies which are not commercially manufactured specifically to serve a medical or remedial function, but which have or may be easily modified to have important characteristics that safely and cost-effectively provide necessary supports.

(i) Speech, Hearing, and Language Services, services of a professional licensed under ORS 681.250 that are defined and approved for purchase under the approved the approved State Medicaid Plan. These services are available to maintain a child's skills after the service limits of the State Medicaid Plan have been reached, either through private or public resources.

(j) Transportation Services, payment per mile for extraordinary mileage required to transport a child to urban medical centers from distant rural communities.
