#### RULES AND REGULATIONS ALL GENERAL RULES APPLY

- 1. Plants must be in your possession 30 days prior to exhibit.
- 2. No inferior exhibit will receive a ribbon.
- 3. No artificial flowers are accepted.
- 4. A person who is exhibiting for the first time, or who has won fewer than ten ribbons in a class in the last three years shall be considered a novice in that class.
- 5. A person who has won ten or more ribbons in a class in the three previous years shall be considered an amateur in that class.
- 6. Professionals and Advanced Amateurs will be judged separately from other non-professionals.
- 7. Professionals include teachers, judges, instructors, advisors and owner/operators/demonstrators engaged in business related to the area of exhibit and anyone who sells their items for more than

When entering as a Professional, please add a P after the lot number (example 001-P)

#### When entering as an Advamced Amateur, please add AA after the lot number (example 001-AA)

- 8. The following are NOT permitted in floral shows; natural birds' nests, shells, stuffed birds, butterflies, or insects, fish, birds, or animals. Sea fans, coral, sponges, bones, antlers, etc., are permissible; the designer must exercise good taste. Naturally shed feathers (from non-endangered species) may be used.
- 9. All exhibits must remain intact until Noon on Sunday August 11th.

#### SOME FLOWER HINTS

- 1. All flowers should be named for extra credit. Be sure to include cultivars names.
- 2. Cut your flowers in late afternoon of the day before they are exhibited; place immediately in deep lukewarm water and keep out of the drafts in a dark place.
- 3. Select material in its prime and pest free; foliage should be clean and neither chewed nor torn.
- 4. Roses should have healthy stems and foliage with blossoms 1/2 to 2/3 open.
- 5. Gladioli should have 5 to 7 florets open, none removed, a long stiff straight stem and one leaf.
- 6. Dahlias should have 2 leaves, check underside. No buds, center should show only in single or collarettes
- 7. Water lilies; cut soon as fully open on the first day. Put a few drops of paraffin in the flower to keep it from closing. Flowers may be displayed either floating or on stems.
- 8. Herbs should be pre-bloom.
- 9. Pots and moveable containers must be clean and leak-proof.
- 10. Containers for cut flowers will be furnished by the fair.
- 11. Exhibitors are asked to replace cut flowers as often as necessary for the duration of the Fair.
- 12. A collection by definition in the judge's book consists of 5 or more stems of different color AND variety.
- 13. Arrangements should not contain flags or any product advertisement. Use ribbons only if specified.
- 14. Wedging of the single blooms is allowed: (wrapping stem in clear Plastic wrap to support upright display)
