RULES AND REGULATIONS ALL GENERAL RULES APPLY

1. Please read all four sections of the General Rules at the beginning of the book.
2. Exhibitors must be residents of Polk County for at least 30 days prior to the Fair.
3. Items which have been shown at a previous county fair may not be entered.
4. *All exhibits must be made by the person under whose name they are entered. Sometimes children need assistance to complete a project; if the child did not do the whole project by himself, please indicate with a note what part was done (or not done) by the child.*
5. Exhibitors must enter their work according to age or grade depending on the class. Age is based on the youth's age on the first day of the Fair: August 7, 2024. Grade is based on the school year just completed. Exhibitors entering in Youth Arts & Crafts MUST enter their grade, age, and date of birth in the appropriate places on the entry form. There is a special class for 3- and 4-year-old children (see Class 109 for information).
6. Exhibitors may enter only one item in each lot. An item cannot be placed in two different classes or lots. An item will be entered under "any other" only if it cannot be classified anywhere else. Two items that fit the same lot will not be classified "any other."
7. The exhibitor of art should know what medium he or she used to create the exhibit, such as acrylic or watercolor so that the exhibit can be placed in the correct lot. It would be wise to ask teachers and write it on the back of the artwork. If the exhibitor does not know, the superintendent and staff will place it in the lot that seems most probable.
8. All articles must be dry.
9. Articles made from kits should be marked as such.
10. Coloring of preprinted designs and pictures will not be accepted.
11. Flatwork should be matted or framed; this applies to artwork primarily, but could apply to some crafts and unit studies. If you have questions about framing, please contact the superintendent.
 - a. Unframed artwork should be matted. The artwork should be backed with a sturdy material such as mat board, foam board, cardboard, or heavy cardstock.
 - b. Framed artwork should have a way to hang it: sawtooth for smaller or medium frames; a strong, secure wire for heavy frames.
 - c. Charcoal, pastels, and scratchboard artwork are best displayed behind glass or plastic for their protection. Plastic wrap is acceptable if wrapped neatly, tightly, and securely. Please protect your art!
12. **Unit studies should be display ready — for example, mounted, matted, or placed in a folder or report cover.**
13. *Unit studies—exhibitor must include with the exhibit a written explanation of how the exhibit is connected to the unit study. For example, a robot or covered wagon without an explanation of how it relates to a study in science or history is a model and should be entered under Crafts.*
14. All entries will be judged on workmanship, originality, and presentation. Examples of presentation are matting and framing for flatwork, folders for unit studies, and proper support.
15. Premiums will be awarded according to merit. For example, if there is only one exhibit in a lot, it does not automatically get a premium.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Exhibitor must enter a minimum of 10 exhibits to qualify for "Rising Star of Youth Arts and Crafts." Only twenty exhibits will be eligible for points.
 2. "Rising Star of Youth Arts and Crafts" award will be made on the following basis:
 - 7 points for each 1st
 - 4 points for each 2nd
 - 1 point for each 3rd
 3. The winner of the "Rising Star of Youth Arts and Crafts" award will be posted in the Youth Arts and Crafts department as soon as the tabulations are completed.
16. Ribbons and stars denoting award placement will be as follows: First place—blue; Second place—red; Third place—White/Silver; Participant (no place) - rainbow ribbon (no star). Ribbons and premiums for first, second, and third place can be picked up in the lobby and premium window of the main building when announcements indicate that they are available. Rainbow ribbons are attached to the exhibit and must stay with the exhibit until Sunday.
 17. By entering an exhibit you accept the risk of an exhibit being damaged. The Fair staff will do their best to handle exhibits carefully and protect them. For entry day, it might be helpful to have small items or items with multiple parts placed in a resealable bag or container. If a matted piece of art is hung using binder clips, the mat could be damaged a bit.

5. Exhibits must be well supported. Any Lego design that requires a base MUST be supported by foamboard, heavy cardboard, or wood. Lego baseplates are not enough. Support should not exceed 16"x16".
6. On a 3x5 card, please include an explanation of your exhibit.
7. By entering a Lego creation, you accept the risk of losing pieces.
