New Business

Derek introduced Roberta Riportella – Associate Dean for College of Public Health and Human Services; Extension Family Community Health Program Leader. College of public health includes Family Community Health, SNAP Ed program and 4-H. Roberta provides oversight and direction for all of those programs.

Roberta Riportella - Update

Roberta explained the structure of College of PHHS funding; some people/programs have base funding such as state funding and county funding, most have "soft" funding in the form of grants such as SNAP Ed, SNAP outreach, WAVE, GROW, EFNEP, etc.

Cooperative Extension (National level) has 6 priority areas: 1) Health in All Policies; 2) Health Literacy; 3) Integrated Nutrition, Health, Environment, Ag Systems; 4) Chronic Disease Prevention and Management; 5) Health Insurance Literacy; 6) Positive Youth Development for Health.

Extension Family Community Health Program Goals (from most recent OSU College of PHHS strategic plan):

- Promote healthy Lifestyles Individual Level
- Cultivate strong families and support systems Family Level
- Grow healthy organizations Organizational Level
- Foster healthy communities Community Level

Columbia Gorge Region, OR/WA was the winner of the 2016 Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (RWJF) Culture of Health Prize. They were one of just a few winners selected from over 200 applicants. They were honored for their efforts to ensure that all residents have the opportunity to live healthier lives.

Direction and focus of Family Community Health Program

Direct education vs. Policy Systems Environment (PSE) Activities

- Direct Education = Focus on individual vs. PSE = focus on larger segment of population
- Direct Education = Focus on individual choices vs. PSE = modify environment to make healthy choices practical and available
- Direct Education = Use education and awareness to promote healthy choices vs. PSE = address conditions so people are more likely to act on their education and awareness

In the past, SNAP Ed funding has only been able to be used on Direct Education. That has changed – now a portion of funding has to be used towards Policy Systems Environment (PSE) activities.

Policy change activity: aimed at creating or amending laws/regulations/ordinances, etc.

Examples - Passing law on unhealthy food, passing law to allow residents to plant community gardens in vacant plots, prohibiting junk food in schools

Systems change: fundamentally alter the way a program/organization, etc. operates with regard to a particular issue.

Examples - Implementation of "farm-to-clinic" program, create community plan to account for health impacts of new projects.

Environmental change activity: efforts to create assets in the community that promote health and well-being.

Examples - Install pedestrian friendly intersections to promote walking & biking, Improvements in layout/display of foods in grocery stores to promote healthy foods.

Comment from group: Commended the Rethink Your Drink presentation (demonstrates amount of sugar in various drinks, especially soda). That demonstration had such an impact and really made you think about how much sugar is in the drinks that you drink. If this could make such an impact on an adult who already has an idea of the health implications, it would probably make an even more significant impact on children. These are the kinds of demonstrations and education that Extension needs to be getting out to the community. The need of the FCH position in Polk County to address local needs in concert with the goals of the OSU program in partnership with local entities (Polk County).

FCH position for Polk County

Roberta expressed that the need for an FCH position in Polk County is still a priority for her. As soon as resources are available she is committed to putting an FCH position in Polk County. Due to the governor's proposed budget, she could not go ahead with filling the position until she knows there will be funding to support it long term.

Admin Update - Derek Godwin

State budget

The Governor's Recommended Budget for the 2017-19 biennium was "flat", which means it proposes no increases for the OSU Statewide Public Service Programs -- the Extension Service, Agricultural Experiment Station, and Forest Research Laboratory, known as the "OSU Statewides."

A continued service level increase of \$9.4 million would be needed to provide the same level of service next biennium as what was provided during the current biennium. Cost increases for the OSU Statewides are primarily driven by state mandates and state policies that require state retirement and health insurance benefits and salary increases. The Governor's recommended budget will have the effect of eliminating nearly 70 percent of the programmatic increases the legislature approved last session.

We are asking supporters to speak up for Extension in the legislative process of establishing the state budget.

RECOMMENDED:

The Board of Directors approve the purchase of insurance (liability, car and contents only) from CIS in the amount of \$1,428.22.

ISSUE:

Should the District purchase insurance for fiscal year 2017-18?

BACKGROUND:

During the current fiscal year, the District began purchasing insurance for general liability coverage, auto coverage and contents only coverage on their rental space.

The coverage includes a \$5 million limit on general liability and auto coverage. The contents only coverage includes \$100,000 (increased from \$75,000).

FISCAL IMPACT:

The cost associated with the insurance is \$1,428.22. This amount was within the budget that was adopted.

ADOPTION OF THE 2017-2018 BUDGET

RECOMMENDATION:

The Board adopt Resolution 17-01 in the matter of the 4-H, Master Gardener, Agriculture, Forestry, Extension District Budget, Appropriation of Funds and Imposing of Taxes for fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017.

ISSUE:

Should the Board of Directors adopt the recommended budget and the levying of taxes for fiscal year 2017-2018?

BACKGROUND:

The Budget Committee met May 16, 2017 and approved the 2017-2018 fiscal year budget. During those deliberations the Budget Committee reviewed and discussed the budget for upcoming year and set a property tax rate to levy.

Attachment 1 is the budget recommended for adoption. The budget includes increases in revenues and expenses of \$13,000 that were added to the Approved Budget.

Attachment 2 is budget resolution 17-01. The Resolution for your consideration has total appropriations in the amount of \$455,000. The permanent property tax rate being considered in the Resolution is \$0.075/\$1,000 which is the permanent rate established by the Department of Revenue for the District.

DISCUSSIONS:

There were no changes to the approved budget for your consideration. As a result, the total operating budget for the District is \$455,000 for the upcoming fiscal year.

ALTERNATIVES:

The following are alternatives before the Board:

- 1. Adopt the recommended Budget as presented.
- 2. Modify the recommended budget with additions/deletions to the Budget. Your limits on additions to the Budget can not exceed 10% for any given fund.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Total budget for the District is \$455,000.
