GRAND RONDE SANITARY DISTRICT BUDGET HEARING MINUTES May 10, 2017

CALL TO ORDER AND NOTE OF ATTENDANCE

At 9:25 a.m., Trustee Craig Pope declared the meeting of the Grand Ronde Sanitary District Budget Committee to be in session. Trustee Wheeler and Trustee Ainsworth were present.

Staff present:

Greg Hansen, Interim Manager Heather Chase, District Secretary

Greg Hansen explained that the Sanitary District has advertised to recruit for members to serve on the Budget Committee, but none have volunteered, so the District is proceeding with the Budget Process with just the Trustees.

ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN

MOTION:

TRUSTEE AINSWORTH MOVED, TRUSTEE WHEELER SECONDED, TO APPOINT TRUSTEE POPE AS THE GRAND RONDE SANITARY DISTRICT BUDGET COMMITTEE CHAIRMAN FOR FISCAL YEAR 2017-2018.

ELECTION OF SECRETARY

TRUSTEE AINSWORTH MOVED, TRUSTEE WHEELER SECONDED, TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE GRAND RONDE SANITARY DISTRICT BUDGET COMMITTEE MEETING OF MAY 18, 2016.

MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

BUDGET MESSAGE - FISCAL YEAR 2017-2018

Fiscal year 2017-18 will be a status quo operating budget for the District this upcoming year. Looking to the future and defining long-term strategies for the District should be the primary focus for the upcoming budget year.

The operating budget for the upcoming year will be as follows:

Revenues:

The total revenues for the District this year are projected to be \$167,500. The primary source of revenue is still the beginning fund balance and charges for services.

Expenditures:

The 2017-18 budget is proposed at \$167,500, which includes \$36,550 in Personal Services costs (1.0 full-time equivalent), \$77,950 in Materials & Services which covers the main operational needs of the system, \$30,000 in Capital Outlay for system upgrades, and \$23,000 for Contingency.

The overall assessment for the Sanitary District is still very positive. Financially the District is stable, but the District has been burning up reserves by making improvements to the infrastructure (emergency generator, pumps, etc.) over the past few years, including this year. User rates have not changed in the last 30 years and customer satisfaction is still very high.

Future:

The future for the District is still sketchy. As total users of the system are reduced (tribal hookups are being reduced annually) the direction the District takes on as the sanitary provider in the area will most likely have to change operationally.

With an ever shrinking operating budget, the District will have to look at new strategies to insure future operations are maintained. Those strategies will include looking at operations/management structure, rate structure, grant possibilities, co-operative agreements, etc.

DISTRICT REPORT

Mr. Hansen reported that the district budget/contingency continues to decrease over time as revenues are not adequate to cover depreciation and infrastructure repair. Mr. Hansen and Todd Whitaker continue to work with the Tribe and are also in talks with DEQ to find alternative options for funding for needed district upgrades. Most grants available require a 50% match and/or a facilities plan.

PUBLIC COMMENT

At 9:30 a.m. Trustee Pope opened the meeting to Public Comment. No members of the public were in attendance. Hearing no public comment, Trustee Pope closed the public hearing.

BUDGET MESSAGE - FISCAL YEAR 2018-2019

Fiscal year 2018-19 will be a status quo operating budget for the District this upcoming year. As we continue to erode reserves, we need to talk about the long term realities for this entity.

The operating budget for the upcoming year will be as follows:

Revenues:

The total revenues for the District this year are projected to be \$146,000. The primary source of revenue is still the beginning fund balance and charges for services.

Expenditures:

The 2018-19 budget is proposed at \$146,000, which includes \$27,550 in Personal Services costs, \$95,450 in Materials & Services which covers the main operational needs and repairs of the system, \$5,000 in Capital Outlay and \$18,000 for Contingency.

The overall assessment for the Sanitary District is still very positive. Financially the District is stable, but the District has been burning up reserves by making improvements to the infrastructure (pumps, facility repairs, etc.) over the past few years, including this year. User rates have not changed in the last 30 years and customer satisfaction is still very high.

Future:

The future for the District is still sketchy. As total users of the system are reduced (tribal hookups are being reduced annually) the direction the District takes on as the sanitary provider in the area will most likely have to change operationally. On a positive note we have received inquiries about new hook-ups.

With an ever shrinking operating budget, the District will have to look at new strategies to insure future operations are maintained. Those strategies will include looking at operations/management structure, rate structure, grant possibilities, co-operative agreements, etc.
