The public is invited to give their comments on amendments to the law enforcement deadly force plan developed by the Polk County planning authority, created under Senate Bill 111. The bill's purpose is to establish procedures for law enforcement agencies to follow in dealing with use of deadly physical force.

Polk County's proposed amendments to the plan outline education, outreach and training regarding the use of deadly physical force for law enforcement, attorneys employed by the state or local government and community members, in addition to policies dealing with the investigation and immediate aftermath of an incident in which a police officer intentionally used deadly physical force which resulted in the death of another person.

The public hearing will be held Wednesday, May 18, 2022 at 3 p.m. in the main conference room of the Polk County Courthouse, 850 Main St., Dallas, OR 97338.
