### **RECOMMENDATION;**

### **ISSUE:**

Shall the Board of Commissioners vacate several portions of undeveloped right of way in the unincorporated community of Ballston?

## **DISCUSSION:**

This right of way was platted by The Salings Addition to the Town of Ballston in November 1892, as recorded in Book 1, pages 46 and 63, Book of Town Plats, Polk County, Oregon. A citizen request was received by Public Works to vacate several portions of undeveloped right of way in the un-incorporated community of Ballston. A failed attempt was made to obtain agreement by abutting land owners to vacate this road without a public hearing. Public Works has provided notice of this public hearing to affected landowners and the public by posting, publication, and service by certified mail per ORS 368.401 to ORS 368.426.

## FISCAL IMPACT:

Vacation fees to be collected. Recording fees. Tax revenue on the land to be vacated.

### ROAD OFFICIALS REPORT

My assessment is that the approval of the vacation of the unnamed right of way in the unincorporated community of Ballston is in the interest of Polk County. Items required by the Polk County Code of Ordinances and the applicable portions of the Public Works SOP A-4 are presented for your consideration.

These rights of way are not currently being used. There are 3 properties in the affected area.

All of the surrounding properties have access to County Roads; removal of this right of way will not restrict access to the existing properties.

These vacations will not affect postal service, emergency services, schools, utilities, or other services. It is believed that no utilities exist within the right of ways to be vacated, however any utilities within the vacated right of way would serve the landowner and be their responsibility. An easement would be reserved for any existing utilities. Public Works has reviewed the road for permitted utilities, none exist.

This right of way is not within, nor does it access National Forest or BLM Lands.

Annual maintenance cost is zero for an undeveloped right of way.

It is in the interest of the County to eliminate right of way where no significant reason exists for the right of way to be retained. Therefore, as stated earlier, my assessment is that the approval of the vacation of the undeveloped right of way in the unincorporated community of Ballston is in the interest of Polk County.







Urban Growth Boundary Taxlots

# Intergovernmental Agreement Among Linn, Marion, Polk and Yamhill Counties Governing the Mid-Willamette Jobs Council

WHEREAS, the Workforce Investment Act of 1998 and its successor, the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014, allow local governments to form workforce investment areas; and

WHEREAS, Linn, Marion, Polk and Yamhill Counties have applied for and received local workforce area designation; and

WHEREAS, counties in a local workforce investment area are required to adopt an intergovernmental agreement establishing a consortium of elected officials, now therefore,

WHEREAS, the counties wish to continue the consortium established by the intergovernmental agreement executed December 10, 2014 that created the Mid-Willamette Jobs Council.

IT IS AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

- **1. Effective Date:** This agreement shall take effect upon final signature and supercede the prior intergovernmental agreement referenced above.
- 2. Purpose: The purpose of this agreement is to govern the consortium of county elected officials for the Mid-Valley workforce area covering Linn, Marion, Polk and Yamhill Counties, hereinafter collectively referred to as the "parties." Local workforce areas were established by the Workforce Investment Act of 1998 ("WIA") as amended by the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014 ("WIOA").
- 3. Consortium Composition: The Mid-Willamette Jobs Council ("MWJC") shall have an eight-member board consisting of two county commissioners chosen by each of the four counties that are parties to this agreement. The third county commissioner in each county shall serve as an alternate to substitute for a commissioner from that county in his or her absence or unavailability for one or more MWJC board meetings. A county commissioner serving as an alternate shall have the full authority of a MWJC board member at that meeting.
- **4. Bylaws:** The MWJC shall have bylaws that provide the rules and regulations for the operation of meetings and proceedings of the consortium.
- 5. The MWJC Chair: The MWJC shall elect a Chair and a Vice Chair in accordance with its bylaws. The Chair shall perform chief local elected official responsibilities described in

WIOA, in other applicable Federal and State statutes, rules, policies and procedures, in workforce contracts and grant agreements, in this agreement and in MWJC's bylaws. The Vice Chair shall perform the Chair's responsibilities when the Chair is absent.

- 6. **Consortium Decisions:** Each of the eight members of MWJC's board shall have one vote. A quorum shall consist of five or more MWJC board members. Decisions shall require the approval of five or more MWJC board members. Board members may attend meetings in person or electronically as permitted by Oregon laws.
- 7. Workforce Board Appointments: The MWJC board shall appoint the Mid-Valley Workforce Board (the "Workforce Board"). The Workforce Board shall meet WIOA Section 107 composition requirements and certification requirements established by the Oregon Workforce Investment Board ("OWIB") and the Governor of Oregon. Workforce Board members shall serve staggered three year terms and shall continue serving until (a) resignation, (b) removal by the MWJC board, (c) ceasing to work in and effectively represent the sector they were chosen to represent, or (d) until a successor is chosen by the MWJC, whichever occurs first.
- 8. The Strategic Workforce Plan and Budget: MWJC shall review and approve the Mid-Valley workforce area's strategic plan and annual budget, including major modifications thereto.
- **9.** The Grant Subrecipient and Administrative Agency: The MWJC shall designate the Mid-Valley workforce area's grant recipient and administrative agency. The designation shall be included in the partnership agreement with the Workforce Board.
- **10. Oversight:** The MWJC shall receive and review Mid-Valley workforce area monitoring and audit reports and shall carry out all local elected official oversight functions described in grant agreements, in applicable Federal and State statutes, rules and policies and in the partnership agreement with the Workforce Board.
- **11.Code of Conduct:** MWJC and the Workforce Board shall mutually adopt a Code of Conduct covering all Mid-Valley workforce area activities and expenditures.
- **12. Liability:** The local grant recipient and administrative entity designated pursuant to paragraph eight, above, shall hold the MWJC and its officers and the parties to this agreement harmless from any and all claims, court costs, fees and penalties, settlements, judgments, legal costs and any other liabilities of any kind arising from the management of the Mid-Valley workforce area. An indemnification clause shall be included in the partnership agreement between the MWJC, the Workforce Board and the local grant recipient and administrative entity. If there is any residual liability for MWJC or the Counties which are parties to this agreement, liability shall be apportioned as follows: (a) the County or Counties in which the action or inaction occurred giving rise to the residual liability shall hold the other parties harmless; (b) if a specific County or group of Counties are not directly associated with the residual liability, the parties shall each be liable in proportion to their respective populations as determined by the last available census data at the time the actions or inaction causing the residual liability occurred.
- **13. Agreement Adoption and Termination:** This agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts which, when combined, shall constitute the entire MWJC agreement. This agreement shall remain in effect until terminated by two or more of the parties by giving

notice of intent to terminate on or before December 31<sup>st</sup> of any year. Termination shall be effective at midnight on the subsequent June 30<sup>th</sup>, the end of the Mid-Valley workforce area's program year. This agreement may also be terminated by the MWJC or by operation of law.

**14. Agreement Amendment:** This agreement may be amended at any time if all four parties so agree in writing.

# **Bylaws**

## **ARTICLE I: Definitions**

The following terms are used in these bylaws:

"Bylaws" means this set of Mid-Willamette Jobs Council ("MWJC") bylaws.

"Board" means the eight-member board of directors of the MWJC.

"Chair" means the MWJC's chairperson.

"Grant recipient" means the corporate entity designated by the Mid-Willamette Jobs Council to receive state and federal funds allocated to the region by the state of Oregon through the Mid-Willamette Jobs Council.

"Intergovernmental Agreement" means the intergovernmental agreement between Linn, Marion, Polk and Yamhill Counties establishing the MWJC.

"**Member**" means a county elected official appointed to the MWJC board by their county.

"**Partnership Agreement**" means the agreement between the MWJC and the Mid-Valley workforce area's grant recipient.

**"WIOA"** means the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014, as amended from time to time.

"Workforce Board" means the board of directors of the Mid-Valley workforce area's grant recipient.

### ARTICLE II: Purpose

The MWJC's purpose is to perform the consortium of local elected official duties listed in WIOA, in State of Oregon laws policies and procedures, in the Intergovernmental Agreement and in the Partnership Agreement.

### **ARTICLE III: Members and Meetings**

### A. MWJC Members

The MWJC Board shall consist of eight county elected officials, each with one vote, as specified in the Intergovernmental Agreement. Each of the four Mid-Valley workforce area counties shall appoint their two MWJC Board members. The third county commissioner in each county may serve as an alternate to substitute for a commissioner from that county in his or her absence or unavailability for one or more MWJC board meetings. A county commissioner serving as an alternate shall have the full authority of a MWJC board member at that meeting.

# **B.** Meetings

# 1. Regular Meetings and Notices

The MWJC Board shall determine the time and place of its regular meetings in advance and authorizes the Chair to call special meetings. Meeting notices shall be given at least three (3) days prior to the date of the meeting unless special conditions make advance notice impracticable, in which case notice and a description of the purpose of the meeting shall be given not less than 24 hours prior to the meeting. Notices may be given electronically.

# 2. Annual Meeting

Unless a different date is set by resolution of the MWJC Board, the annual meeting shall be the first regular meeting on or after July 1 of each year.

# 3. Special Meetings

Special meetings may be held as called by the Chair, by the Vice Chair or by vote of the MWJC Board.

# 4. Minutes

Minutes of each meeting shall be reviewed and approved at subsequent meetings and copies of all approved minutes shall be maintained at the Mid- Valley workforce area's grant recipient's principal office.

# 5. Sunshine Provision

All MWJC Board meetings shall be conducted in accordance with public meeting laws and these bylaws.

## 6. Participation

Participation at MWJC meetings shall be limited to its members, with the following exceptions:

- a. Regularly scheduled agenda items that call for reports or participation by nonmembers;
- b. Comments or reports delivered by the Mid-Valley workforce area grant recipient's Executive; Director and staff.
- c. At the discretion of the Chair, comment or other participation by non-members which is material to the matter under consideration; and,
- d. Comments by the general public delivered in accordance with the meeting agenda or permitted by the meeting Chair.

## 7. Rules

All meetings shall be held in compliance with Oregon law, grant terms, these bylaws and Roberts' Rules of Order, provided that the use of Roberts' Rules of Order shall be solely for the convenience of the MWJC Board and its committees. Failure to comply with Roberts' Rules of Order shall not affect the validity of any action taken which is otherwise in compliance with these bylaws.

In the event of a conflict, the order of precedence shall be Oregon law, grant terms, these bylaws, and Roberts' Rules of Order.

# 8. Agendas

Meeting notices shall contain an agenda of the topics scheduled for consideration. The MWJC may consider and act upon matters at a regular meeting (including the annual meeting) which are not included in the notice agenda, but may not act upon any matter during a special meeting unless that matter was described in the special meeting notice or all of the members are present in person or electronically and do not object to the matter being considered.

# 9. Quorum

Five or more MWJC members shall constitute a quorum. A member is deemed to be present at a meeting for the purpose of determining a quorum even if the member abstains from voting on one or more items on the agenda. To the extent permitted by Oregon law, members may attend meetings by telephone or through other electronic means.

# 10. Manner of Acting and Meeting Attendance

Each MWJC member shall have one (1) vote. Passage of a motion requires a favorable vote by five or more MWJC members.

# Article IV: Workforce Board Appointments

# A. County Representation

The MWJC shall nominate and appoint Workforce Board membership in accordance with WIOA Section 107 and the Intergovernmental Agreement. Appointments shall be made from a pool of candidates brought forward by members of the MWJC Board. MWJC members will determine and agree upon Workforce Board member representation from each county.

# B. Workforce Board Terms of Office

The terms of local workforce development board members are three years from the date of appointment, except that initial appointments shall be staggered.

# C. Resignation and Removal

Workforce Board members shall continue serving until:

- Written resignation is delivered to the Workforce Board Chair or the Mid-Valley workforce area grant recipient's Executive Director. Unless the notice of resignation specifies a later effective date, the resignation will be effective when received,
- 2. Removal by the MWJC board. Members may be removed or suspended with or without cause as authorized by the MWJC Board,
- 3. Ceasing to work in and effectively representing the sector they were chosen to represent, or
- 4. Until a successor is chosen by the MWJC, whichever occurs first.

# ARTICLE V: MWJC Officers

# A. Required Officers

The officers of the MWJC shall include a Chair and a Vice Chair. The Chair and Vice Chair shall be elected from among the eight member board and cannot represent the same county. The MWJC may appoint other officers as deemed necessary. A single member may perform the duties of more than one office, with the exception of the duties of Chair and the Vice Chair, which must be performed by separate members.

# B. Duties of the Chair and Vice Chair

The Chair shall preside at meetings, shall serve as the MWJC's chief spokesperson and signatory and shall perform "chief elected official" duties as specified in WIOA, in the Intergovernmental Agreement and in grant agreements. The Vice Chair shall perform the duties of the Chair in the Chair's absence and shall perform other duties designated by the MWJC.

## C. Election and Term

The MWJC shall elect officers to serve terms of two (2) consecutive years. Election shall be by majority vote of the members at the annual meeting in odd numbered years.

## ARTICLE VI: Committees

The MWJC and its Chair shall have the power to create both standing and ad-hoc committees and work groups. The Chair shall appoint committee members and committee chairs subject to MWJC direction.

## ARTICLE VII: Code of Conduct

The Workforce Board shall adopt a Code of Conduct, which shall meet all Federal and Oregon requirements.

## ARTICLE VIII: MWJC Staff

The Mid-Valley workforce area grant recipient's staff shall serve as staff to the MWJC.

## ARTICLE IX: Bylaw Changes

These bylaws may be amended or repealed by an affirmative vote of five or more MWJC members at a regular or special meeting. Notice, which shall specify the changes to be made, shall be delivered to all members no less than seven (7) days prior to the meeting at which bylaw amendment or repeal is to be acted upon.

## ARTICLE X: Bylaws Enactment

These MWJC bylaws take effect on the date set forth below.
