17 18 19 20	WHEREAS , Polk County has identified alcohol and drugs, crime, and untreated mental illness, of which unmanaged homeless encampments and conditions are a symptom, as top threats to the health, safety and flourishing of all of its residents; and
21 22 23	WHEREAS , Polk County believes in the dignity and worth of all of its residents, and the overarching good that is achieved when residents are on a path toward the realization of their full potential; and
24 25 26	WHEREAS , Polk County acknowledges that those struggling with homelessness in the mid-Willamette region and throughout Oregon may also contend with the complex diseases of mental illness and/or addiction, whether a precursor to or a result of homelessness; and
27 28 29 30	WHEREAS , the U.S. Surgeon General specifically describes addiction as a brain disorder or disease that results in reduced brain function, that inhibits an individual's ability to make decisions and regulate their actions, emotions, and impulses, and furthermore, that changes in the brain persist long after substance use stops; and
31 32 33	WHEREAS , Polk County recognizes a housing focus is important, but alone will not mitigate mental illness or addiction, and the nature of addiction and serious mental illness can make sufferers unable to recognize their own illnesses or seek help willingly; and
34 35 36	WHEREAS , Polk County agrees that open air drug scenes create an environment that is incompatible with safe, clean and vibrant public spaces, and make recovery from addiction much more difficult; and
37 38	WHEREAS , Polk County believes that all people have a right to clean, safe and vibrant public spaces, as well as safe emergency shelter when needed; and
39 40 41 42	WHEREAS , Polk County believes that harm reduction services, when not antithetical to a recovery-oriented system of care, can be effective in saving lives. However, it must exist within a full continuum of compassionate care that includes prevention, intervention, treatment, and recovery for those suffering from addiction; and
43 44	WHEREAS , Polk County believes that recovery is possible and most will recover if presented with the aforementioned continuum of care.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE POLK COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS that all efforts to address homelessness in which the County and its employees engage must be data driven and concentrated on helping all residents participate in realizing their full human potential by ensuring shelter and psychiatric and addiction care for all who need it, and by protecting public spaces for the use of the entire community.
