





Current State

- Since 2020 Alyrica has constructed 11 new towers in partnership with Polk County that now service 770 customers in the county.
- The 2022 grant project added 5 towers operating on the Tarana G1 platform. With service currently being provided to 240 customers in the target area.
- Project was started on April 30th 2022 and completed on June 16th 2023. With grant funding of \$795K plus additional match by Alyrica Networks.
- Alyrica currently serves over 1,400 customers in Polk County with over 315 on Tarana G1.

2022 North Dallas Project Map










Project Proposal

- Eola Hills Project Area will serve 172 addresses of the 182 unserved addresses identified.
- Customers will be served using Tarana G1 platform that will provide speeds up to 600 Mbps down and 100 Mbps up.
- Project cost approximately \$150,000 plus match.

Background:

The County receives funds from the Oregon Health Authority to provide Public Health Services to residents of the County by way of a grant. This contract is the fourth amendment to the initial award from the State. Discussion:

FOURTH AMENDMENT TO OREGON HEALTH AUTHORITY 2023-2025 INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT FOR THE FINANCING OF PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICES

This Fourth Amendment to Oregon Health Authority 2023-2025 Intergovernmental Agreement for the Financing of Public Health Services, effective July 1, 2023, (as amended the "Agreement"), is between the State of Oregon acting by and through its Oregon Health Authority ("OHA") and Polk County, ("LPHA"), the entity designated, pursuant to ORS 431.003, as the Local Public Health Authority for Polk County. OHA and LPHA are each a "Party" and together the "Parties" to the Agreement.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, OHA and LPHA wish to modify the Fiscal Year 2024 (FY24) Financial Assistance Award set forth in Exhibit C of the Agreement.

WHEREAS, OHA and LPHA wish to modify the Exhibit J information required by 2 CFR Subtitle B with guidance at 2 CFR Part 200;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises, covenants and agreements contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

- 1. This Amendment is effective on October 1, 2023, regardless of the date this amendment has been fully executed with signatures by every Party and when required, approved by the Department of Justice. However, payments may not be disbursed until the Amendment is fully executed.
- 2. The Agreement is hereby amended as follows:
 - **a.** Exhibit C, Section 1 of the Agreement, entitled "Financial Assistance Award" for FY24 is hereby superseded and replaced in its entirety by Attachment A, entitled "Financial Assistance Award (FY24)", attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. Attachment A must be read in conjunction with Section 3 of Exhibit C.
 - **b.** Exhibit J of the Agreement entitled "Information required by 2 CFR Subtitle B with guidance at 2 CFR Part 200" is amended to add to the federal award information datasheet as set forth in Attachment B, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.
- **3.** LPHA represents and warrants to OHA that the representations and warranties of LPHA set forth in Section 4 of Exhibit F of the Agreement are true and correct on the date hereof with the same effect as if made on the date hereof.
- 4. Capitalized words and phrases used but not defined herein shall have the meanings ascribed thereto in the Agreement.
- 5. Except as amended hereby, all terms and conditions of the Agreement remain in full force and effect.
