### DALLAS NEEDS

- **Food Delivery:** 50 families receiving weekly food box delivered directly to their home
- **Food Boxes:** 333 drop-in food boxes prepared.
- **Basic Needs:** More than 100 client drop-ins for items such as hygiene kits, shower passes, bus passes, gas cards, baby items, and more.

In Addition to supporting all Resource Center needs, the Resource Connector team maintains an average caseload of 20-25 DHS Housing Navigator clients. These clients are referred by self sufficiency with the goal of overcoming barriers that keep them from being sustainably housed.

## ENERGY ASSISTANCE

The Resource Center connected **369** households to the Energy Assistance program. From these referrals, an additional **\$336,150** in assistance was granted through the energy assistance program. Average payments on client utilities were **\$1,000.45**. More than 70% of all clients served this year were new to the Energy Assistance program or had not received assistance in more than 3 years.

## UNMET NEEDS

In the 2021-22 fiscal year, approximately 50 Dallas residents visited the Resource Center with needs that we were not able to fund with current funding streams. These needs included: rental application fees and employment related needs such as equipment or fees related to certification.



# 2022-23 FUNDING

## COMMUNITY ACTION AGENCY ★

Oregon Eviction Diversion & Prevention Program \$250,000

- Clients must be under 80% federal Adjusted Median Income
- Cannot be used for clients who have a housing voucher
- Can only be used on rent, utilities and deposits
- Can only be accessed one time every 12 months



## MARION & POLK EARLY LEARNING HUB, INC. ★

Family Support Funds \$13,840

- Clients must have a child in their household who is 5 years or younger
- Client must qualify for a state funded program (OHP, TANF, SNAP)
- Can be used in the following categories: housing, health & safety, transportation, and education
- Limited to \$300 per household, one time annually

## THE CITY OF MONMOUTH

ARPA Funds \$200,000

- Clients must live or work in Monmouth
- Funds are used at the discretion of Resource Center staff

## THE CITY OF INDEPENDENCE

ARPA Funds \$49,500

- Clients must live or work in Independence
- Funds are used at the discretion of Resource Center staff

## DALLAS COMMUNITY FOUNDATION ★

\$5,000

- Clients must live in Dallas
- Funds are used at the discretion of Resource Center staff

## THE SALVATION ARMY ★

Limited Partnership

- Clients must be under 80% federal Adjusted Median Income or qualify for a state funded program (SNAP, TANF, OHP)
- Can only be used to support rent and utilities
- Limited to \$200 per case

## FAMILY PROMISE ★

Limited Partnership

- Clients must be under 80% federal Adjusted Median Income or qualify for a state funded program (SNAP, TANF, OHP)
- Can only be used to support rent and utilities
- Limited to \$200 per case

## DALLAS MINISTERIAL ASSOCIATION

Limited Partnership

- Clients must live in Dallas
- Limited to \$200 per case, as available

Limited Partnership

- Clients must live in Dallas
- Funds are used at the discretion of Service Integration Teams
