Measure No: 27-145

Caption: POLK COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS & EVENT CENTER LOCAL OPTION TAX

Question: Shall Polk County authorize a five-year Fairgrounds/Event Center local option tax of up to \$0.15/\$1,000 assessed value beginning 2025-26? This measure may cause property taxes to increase more than three percent.

Summary: This measure authorizes Polk County to levy a five (5) year local option tax of up to \$0.15/\$1,000 assessed value beginning in 2025 for the purpose of providing funding to the Polk County Fairgrounds & Event Center for operations, maintenance and improvements.

Monies generated from the local option tax will be used for the operations and maintenance of the facility (approximately 25% annually), and remaining monies will be utilized to make improvements to the electrical system, the resurfacing of the parking areas, replacing interior walkways and paths, interior/exterior improvements to the main building, HVAC upgrades for multiple buildings, the relocation of the maintenance shed, construction of a new main office where the maintenance shed was located, and the building of a new amphitheater/state in the northwest corner of the property.

The authorization of this measure will impact a property with an Assessed Value of \$300,000 (not Real Market Value) by increasing your current property taxes by \$45.00 in year one of the measure.

The \$0.15/\$1,000 local option tax will generate \$1,200,000 in 2025, \$1,248,000 in 2026, \$1,298,000 in 2027, \$1,348,000 in 2028, and \$1,400,000 in 2029 for a total of \$6,494,000. The estimated tax cost for this measure in and ESTIMATE ONLY based on the best information available from the County Assessor at the time of estimate and may reflect the impact of early payment discounts, compression, and the collection rate.

City of Dallas

Measure No: 27-146

Caption: General obligation bonds for Dallas police facilities

Question: Shall City of Dallas issue \$17,200,000 principal amount of general obligation bonds for police facilities? If the bonds are approved, they will be payable from taxes on property or property ownership that are not subject to the limits of sections 11 and 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Summary: If approved, the bonds would finance capital costs of the City including constructing, renovating, and equipping new police facilities, and related improvements and equipment.

Bonds would mature in 30 years or less from the date of issuance and may be issued in one or more series. If approved, the average annual tax rate is estimated to be \$0.52 per \$1,000.00 of assessed value. Actual rates may vary based upon interest rates incurred and changes in assessed value.

City of Salem

Measure No: 24-514

Caption: Five-year Operating Levy for Parks, Recreation, Libraries, and Senior Services.

Question: Shall Salem maintain parks, recreation, library, Center 50+ services; with 5-year levy, at \$0.98 per \$1,000 assessed value, beginning 2025-26? This measure may cause property taxes to increase more than three percent.

Summary:

If approved, levy funds would support Salem park operations, including cleaning and maintenance, more library hours, recreation activities and Center 50+ senior programs for five years, beginning July 1, 2025.

In 2024, due to budget constraints, the City reduced funding to city services by more than \$6 million impacting parks, recreation, library, Center 50+, youth development, public safety, and other services. Additional reductions may be necessary without additional revenue.

Funds from this levy would restore, maintain and be limited to:

- Parks cleaning, maintenance, and programs;
- Recreation Services operations and programs;
- Public Library operations, programs, and restored hours at the main and west Salem branches; and
- Center 50+ operations and programs.

Use of levy revenue for these services will free General Funds to be used for other services, like Police, Fire, and Emergency Response.

The cost of this levy is estimated at \$220
per year for a typical home with an assessed (not market) value of \$224,000.

An oversight committee will review levy expenditures, provide annual reports. Independent audit required.

By fiscal year, this levy is estimated to raise the following amounts:

25-26 - \$14,002,000
26-27 - \$14,611,000
27-28 - \$15,247,000
28-29 - \$15,910,000
29-30 - \$16,602,000
Total - \$76,372,000

Chemeketa C.C.

Measure No: 24-513

Caption: Bonds to Upgrade and Enhance CTE, Technology, Facilities, and Safety

Question: Shall Chemeketa issue up to \$140,000,000 in bonds to improve career technical education spaces and upgrade technology, facilities, and safety? If the bonds are approved, they will be payable from taxes on property or property ownership that are not subject to the limits of sections 11 and 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Summary: Chemeketa Community College proposes a bond measure in a principal amount not to exceed \$140,000,000 which would allow the College to leverage an \$8,000,000 state grant. The bonds are expected to finance capital costs, including:

*Expanded Career and Technical Education; Improved Teaching/Learning Spaces:

*Creation of new Trades Center for skilled trades

*Increase CTE capacity in health care, behavioral health, emergency services, health and fitness

*Woodburn campus science lab

*Brooks campus first responder expansion

*Classroom and learning space improvement

*Building/Infrastructure Improvements:

*Extend useful life of buildings, HVAC, roofs, elevators, interior renovations

*Modernize technology

*Leverage \$8 million state grant for a community disaster resource site with seismic improvements, student center, health facility

*Community athletic fields

*ADA compliance

*Improved Safety

*Cameras, lighting, parking lot improvements to enhance safety

*Site improvements, demolition, furnishings, equipment, bond issuance costs

Bonds may be issued in multiple series; each maturing within 21 years from issuance. Bonds are estimated to cost \$0.27 per \$1,000 of assessed value. Actual levy rate may differ due to final interest rates and changes in assessed value.

Caption: BONDS FOR SAFETY, SECURITY, AND CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS TO SCHOOL BUILDINGS

Question: Shall Sheridan School District issue up to \$6,000,000 in principal amount of bonds for improvements to school buildings?

If the bonds are approved, they will be payable from taxes on property or property ownership that are not subject to the limits of sections 11 and 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Summary: The District has been awarded a \$6,000,000 State grant that will be available only if bonds are approved.

If approved, bonds would finance capital costs, expected to include:

- Safety & Security Improvements
 - Paging/clocks/intercom devices
 - Access control
 - Security cameras and systems
 - Exterior lighting
- Sheridan High School
 - Secured entry
 - Replace asbestos flooring
 - Roof repair and replacement
 - Update interior lighting
 - Interior updates
 - Paving and parking lot improvements and expansion
 - Exterior lighting
 - Update science lab
- Faulconer-Chapman School
 - HVAC System
- Faulconer-Chapman Old Gym
 - Update music classrooms, gym, locker rooms, bathrooms and storage areas
 - Roof restoration
- Site improvements, furnishings, equipment, bond issuance costs.

The District would establish a citizen oversight committee to ensure proceeds are used for purposes indicated.

Bonds may be issued in multiple series; each maturing within 25 years from issuance. The estimated annual tax rate would be \$0.80 per \$1,000 of assessed value. Actual levy rate may differ due to final interest rates and changes in assessed value.
