REUSE IT !

Save money by buying used items, borrowing or renting items, or reusing items you already have. Used book stores, appliance shops, bicycle shops, clothing and convenient stores (thrift stores, Goodwill, etc) will save \$\$.

REDUCE AND THINK WASTE PREVENTION !

Recycling conserves resources, but waste prevention is better by not creating waste in the first place. Buy less over-packaged material and buy in bulk. Use rechargeable batteries, print on both sides of the sheet of paper, and leave grass clippings on the lawn. You can reduce junk mail by removing your name from most National Mailing lists- contact the Direct Marketing Assoc. (DMA) Mail Preference Service, P.O. Box 9008 Farmingdale, NY 11735-9008.

COMPOSTING YARD DEBRIS AT HOME !

Throwing grass clippings and green food waste into the garbage is a waste. This organic matter can produce valuable compost to add to your lawn and garden. Good gardeners know how important organic matter is to soil health and tilth.

COMPOSTING IS EASY TO DO:

1. Provide a pile or bin to stack waste.
2. Provide green/brown yard debris.
3. Provide water-damp like a sponge.
4. Provide air - turn the pile weekly.
