Voices of Youth

The Youth and Young adult subcommittee is conducting a Voices of Youth Survey during the month of October in efforts to shed light and bring awareness to Youth Homelessness in our community. The survey target age range is youth aged 11-24 in the Marion and Polk counties. The survey collects data about current housing status, whether the youth feel it is a safe space, school status, employment status and a few other demographic components. Our hope is to collect data about youth homelessness as our PIT count data significantly underrepresented youth homelessness. We will be sharing our data outcomes with all youth providers and schools for outreach opportunities. This survey will help kick off Novembers National Runaway Youth month where we plan to share the data collected from the survey.
