Update on Shop With the Sheriff	<p>Rhonda Holder gave a brief update on Shop With the Sheriff that will take place on December 8, 2012. \$300 was encumbered for the event and will go towards food boxes for families in need.</p>

Angela Gonzales, Parent Resource and Education Program – Gave a brief reminder of the parenting groups offered free of charge to attendees.
