Shop with Sheriff Summary	The Shop with Sheriff event went great. The event, coordinated by Rhonda Holder, served 25 families from the Falls City and Grand Ronde areas. In all approximately 25 families were served. This is a great experience for kids and the deputies.
Liberty House & Juliette's House Presentation	Presentations were given on the services offered at Liberty House and Juliette's House. The agencies are set up to help when there are questions around abuse in a sexual nature or due to neglect or injury. These agencies are places to call to sort out criteria for reporting. They work closely with DHS Child Welfare and law enforcement. There are 18 centers around the State.
	Juliette's House serves Yamhill and Polk Counties. They see children on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. Liberty House serves Marion and Polk Counties. In order for children to receive services they must be accompanied by an authorized person (parent or guardian) and have to be referred by DHS or be in their custody. Teens can self-advocate for medication and forensic examination. Coordinated care can be provided with primary care provider. The Houses provide a free medical examination, evaluation and forensic interview. Those that have experienced, or been exposed to, domestic violence can be referred to counseling resources. There are resources for non-offending parents. Individuals can call the agencies to help sort out whether something is reportable or not.
